1. Call to Order

Chair Shepard called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Principals' Reports

Principal Lannan said they had a very successful Kindergarten Information Night.

Principal Costa said they had received \$1,000 from Families First. This will go towards Wellness. Marston had an Epilepsy Awareness Week. There is a third grader who is working with the Blue Ocean Society on the "Skip the Straw" movement.

Principal O'Connor said construction at the Academy is going very well.

Student Services

Jessica Parsons presented her report. Mr. DeLuca asked if there were any new students. Ms. Parsons replied that there were two new students.

Ms. Bridle asked Ms. Parsons how she plans for next year. Ms. Parsons replied that she looks at the number going to Winnacunnet and numbers in the Kindergarten class. Mr. De Luca asked how many students each staff member is responsible for. Ms. Parsons said that was around 13 students.

Technology

Greg Limperis said they are looking at other options for Chromebooks. The Technology Department has been preparing for future build and renovation of the Hampton Academy building project.

Ms. Bridle asked Principal Lannan about safety measures. Principal Lannan said students are never alone.

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Murphy congratulated Barbara Garand of Centre School for being nominated for the 2019 NH Teacher of the Year.

Superintendent Murphy said the Academy project is progressing at a good pace. Weather was a problem and set work back about three weeks. Everyone feels these three weeks can be made up quickly. They are pouring floors now and working on the roof over the gym. They are now waiting for an 8,000 lb. beam which will go over the stage.

Superintendent Murphy said she would like to recommend to the Board that the current 5th Graders remain at Marston as 6th Graders. Everyone thinks it went well this year and it would afford more time for work on the renovation. Superintendent Murphy said that if she was given authority from the Board to do this, she will meet with students, teachers and parents.

Moved by Mr. DeLuca, seconded by Ms. Shepard to have the current 5th Graders at Marston remain there as 6th Graders for the 2018-19 school year.

Vote: 5 yes, 0 no. Motion passed unanimously.

Enrollment as of April 1st was 1108.

Superintendent Murphy passed out information pm after school activities, the letter for the end of the school year and the list of responsibilities for Committees.

Superintendent Murphy asked the Board to accept the resignation of Rebecca Traynor.

Moved by Mr. DeLuca, seconded by Ms. Ring, to accept the resignation of Rebecca Traynor.

Vote: 5 yes, 0 no. Motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Shepard asked who is on the committee to review teacher evaluations. Superintendent Murphy said it included teachers and administrators from each of the three schools.

Business Administrator

Mr. Lunney presented the financials. Chair Shepard asked if everything was okay with spending. Mr. Lunney replied that it was.
